BETTER DENVER BOND PROGRAM IMPROVEMENTS AT DENVER PUBLIC LIBRARIES

RE: Bond program improvements at Denver Public Libraries

We are pleased to report work is underway to complete the repair/maintenance work at branch libraries as funded by the Better Denver bond program.

Specifically, in 2008, The Eugene Field Branch Library will realize the following improvements:

- Replacement and upgrades to several building and life safety systems that have been deferred over the years. This includes the replacement of the fire detection and alarm system with state-of-the-art technology, and the replacement of the 30-year-old, roof-mounted heating, ventilating and air conditioning unit with an innovative, high energy efficient model.
- The installation of several automated library material self-check stations and the introduction of Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) to Library materials will revolutionize how our customers will be able to access and acquire Library books and media and conduct other Library-related business.
- This represents approximately \$250,000 dollars worth of repairs and upgrades.

In addition, the bond program will include three new branch libraries in Green Valley Ranch, Stapleton, and on the west side of Denver. Work is already underway to begin those projects, and all three should be finished by end of 2012. The Central Library has also benefited from bond-funded renovations and upgrades completed during summer 2008.

These improvements are part of the infrastructure package approved by voters in November 2007, (Ballot Issues B thru I) which also includes funding for parks, streets, public safety, cultural institutions and other important infrastructure needs. In all, over 200 projects are part of the \$550 million bond package, and all projects will be completed within 5 years (end of 2012).
