

What is Geocaching?

Geocaching is a real-world treasure hunting game using GPS-enabled devices such as a smart phone. Participants navigate to a specific set of GPS coordinates and then attempt to find the geocache (container) hidden at that location. Directions:

- Start by registering at **geocaching.com/myaccount/register** for a free geocaching membership.
- When you find the geocache, sign the logbook and locate and record the special code, then return the geocache to its original location.

- The first 200 completers will get a limited edition Denver Public Library Geocoin.
- Coins can be claimed by submitting your completed passport to engage@denverlibrary.org, one coin per family or "geo-nic".
- If a location is closed for renovation, it may be skipped.
